The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at 9:00 a.m. in the Office of the County Commissioners on July 31, 2012. Rose called the meeting to order. Those present were C. J. Rose, Chairman; Brad Raven, Member; Frank King, Member; Rita Holland-Moore, Dayla Sue Pugh, Rodney Seawright, Bruce Williams and Tammy Millikan, County Clerk/Secretary.

Motion was made by Rose and seconded by King to approve the minutes of the July 23, 2012 meeting. Motion carried with all members voting aye.
