

Beaver County, Oklahoma
County Commissioners Proceedings
December 9, 2024

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at 9:00 a.m. in the Office of the County Commissioners on December 9, 2024. Notice of the meeting was posted for public information on December 5, 2024 at 4:00 p.m. at the East, West, and North entrances to the Beaver County Courthouse and www.beaver.okcounties.org.

Regier called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Those presents were Kerry Regier, Chairman; C.J. Rose, Vice-Chairman; Roy Fleming, Member; Reuben Parker, Kelsey Kile, Lisa Caldwell, Julie Lemieux, John Kiley and Kelly Yeomans, County Clerk/Secretary.

Motion was made by Regier and seconded by Fleming to approve the minutes of the December 2, 2024 meeting. Motion carried with voting; Fleming, Aye; Rose, Aye and Regier, Aye.

Public Comment: Lisa Caldwell gave a brief background on all the duties and responsibilities of the Dispatchers. Beaver County is the 4th largest in square miles in Oklahoma. They dispatch 24/7-365 days a year for numerous entities other than the sheriff deputies. Julie presented to the Board a notebook of the Jail Administrator/Dispatcher/Adm. Assistant and the numerous duties that's required for these positions. The suggestion of the 911 Coordinator /Head of Dispatcher being separate from sheriffs' responsibilities as well as recommending jailers to oversee the inmates versus the dispatchers was discussed. All the sheriff employees present at this meeting felt that dispatchers taken away from the radios to check on inmates was a huge safety hazard for our deputies. They have to leave the radio to do inmate checks, pass meds, clean etc. Julie also went over all the certifications and license required to be fully operational such as OLETS, LASO, CJIS to name a few. Kelsie Kile also relayed her concern for the safety of the officers if they are away from the radio. John Kiley was present and just voiced his concerns regarding the new hires. He is the Town of Beaver Chief of Police and has been assisting the County as needed due to being short staffed of deputies. No action was taken from the Board as this was only public comment.

Motion was made by Rose and seconded by Fleming to approve the Proposal and Resolution for Lease Purchase via Sourcewell Contract #011723-JDC in the amount of \$410,168.00. This is for a John Deere Road Grader 6WD for Dist. #2. Resolution approved by ADA, Parker Olmstead. Jason Bergdall with Yellowhouse was unable to attend in person. Motion carried with voting; Rose, Aye; Fleming, Aye and Regier, Aye.

Motion was made by Regier and seconded by Fleming to accept a donation from Beaver County Stöckyards and Bennet Construction Inc. on behalf of Forgan, Turpin, Balko, Slapout, Gate, Elmwood and Beaver Fire Departments during the Stockyard yearly fundraiser in the amount of \$4,000.00, receipt #240 to be divided equally. Motion carried with voting; Rose, Aye; Fleming, Aye and Rose, Aye.
