County Commissioners Proceedings
December 29, 2025

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at 9:00 a.m. in the Office of the County Commissioners on December 29, 2025. Notice of the meeting was posted for public information on December 23, 2025 at 4:00 p.m. at the East, West and North entrances to the Beaver County Courthouse and www.beaver.okcounties.org.

Rose called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Those present were C.J. Rose, Chairman; Roy Fleming, Vice-Chairman; Kerry Regier, Member; Scott Mitchell, Sheriff; Chuck Lemieux, Assessor and Kelly Yeomans, County Clerk/Secretary.

Motion was made by Rose and seconded by Regier to approve the minutes of the December 22, 2025 meeting. Motion carried with voting; Rose, Aye; Fleming, Aye and Regier, Aye.

Motion was made by Rose and seconded by Regier to accept the ongoing Sheriff Funding Assistance Grant monies in the amount of \$150,000.00, receipt #260. Motion carried with voting; Regier, Aye; Rose, Aye and Fleming, Aye.

Motion was made by Rose and seconded by Regier to approve a Cash Fund Estimate of Needs and Request for *Special Apportionment* for Sheriff Funding Assistance Grant Account #1574-2-0400-2005 in the amount of \$150,000.00, receipt #260. Motion carried with voting; Fleming, Aye; Regier, Aye and Rose, Aye.

Motion was made by Rose and seconded by Regier to appoint Roy Fleming as Chairman, Kerry Regier, Vice-Chairman and C.J. Rose as Member, effective January 1, 2026. Motion carried with voting; Regier, Aye; Rose, Aye and Fleming, Aye.

Motion was made by Rose and seconded by Regier to approve the amended FY26 Requesting Officers and Receiving Agents to be effective January 1, 2026 as follows: Motion carried with voting; Rose, Aye; Fleming, Aye and Regier, Aye.

Motion was made by Regier and seconded by Rose to table the additional raise request from the Sheriff for the Sheriff dispatchers and deputies. A 5% raise was approved by the Excise Board October 30, 2025 meeting and by the Board of County Commissioners in their October 14, 2025 meeting to be effective January 1, 2026. This was for all general employees including library, fair, maintenance, janitorial employees and Elected Officials. The highway received a raise in October and will not receive an additional raise in January. Discussion on raises was discussed in prior budget meetings but had never been officially approved until those meetings. The Sheriff is wanting to raise his dispatchers an additional 3% and an additional 5% to the deputies, administrative assistants and head dispatcher. This is on top of the 5%. Michell stated the Excise Board had approved him to raise his employees as it was factored into his budget. He put in for an extra deputy but is not hiring an extra one

so he believes he can give them an additional raise above other employees, Discussion was had amongst the Commissioners, the Sheriff and the County Clerk. Fleming did not feel the additional raise was appropriate and did not recall discussion with the Excise Board to approve this. Regier was on board with the additional raise and understood that it had been approved by the Excise Board in previous meetings. Rose spoke of concern with new legislation regarding Ad Valorem Taxes and doing away with property tax. If that passes it will greatly affect our county operations and future budgets. He was not in favor of the additional raise. Yeomans argued that this was not fair to the other employees and it is not right for a brand-new employee to start work and make \$300-\$500 more per month more than our long-term employees, including 25–30-year 1st deputies. All employees received a 3% raise in January 2023. Sheriff dispatchers received another raise on September 1, 2023 and Sheriff deputies received a raise on January 1, 2025. She also relayed that any money not used within their general accounts will roll over the next year for the new budget. The Sheriff employees will get the 5% raise but the additional request will have to be approved by the Excise Board in their January meeting before implementing it if they do approve it. Motion carried with voting; Rose, Aye; Fleming, Aye and Regier, Aye.

Lemieux spoke briefly to the Board regarding the possibility of outsourcing the visual inspection for 2026. He is in the process of obtaining more information and quotes on the cost. He will keep the Commissioners updated and if they feel this is the best way to go then it will be placed on the agenda for approval.

Motion was made by Rose and seconded by Fleming to approve December payroll. Motion carried with voting; Regier, Aye; Fleming, Aye and Rose, Aye.

There being no other business to come before the board at this time, the board adjourned at 11:10 a.m.
